


# Progress Made: Provider Education in Rural and Frontier Communities

- Funding received from CoBank
- Partnered with Farm Bureau and Rocky Mountain Farmers Union to create new modules specific to the agriculture community
- Chronic Pain in Agriculture: Alternative Approaches to Long Term Solutions
- Running on all Cylinders: Understanding Agricultural Communities
- Behavioral Health Issues Among Farming and Ranching Populations-Panel Discussion





## Progress Made: Added Needle Disposal to the Colorado Household Medication Take Back Program



- 62 of 64 counties have a permanent collection box
- 203 locations (pharmacies, hospitals with pharmacy or law enforcement offices)

### **Progress Made: Grant Writing Assistance Program**

### From beginning of program in August 2019 to present:

- Number of contracted grant writers: 18
- 68 organizations were successful in winning grant awards
- Total amount of awards: \$13,587,217
- Program cost: \$424,770

Represents a 32:1 return on investment



### **Impact**

Of the patients who had a high level of participation in the program, 64.3% decreased their ED visits in the six months following engagement compared to 24.8% of patients who did not participate.

## Progress Made: Medication-Assisted Treatment Expansion Program

### From July 2019-present

- Service in 21 rural counties
- Statewide outreach & legislative support
- Served >1500 patients in first 18 months
- Supported by 56 FTE MAT providers
- Anticipated outcomes:
  - Reduced substance use
  - Improved social determinants of health (disability, work, ER use)
  - Improved physical and mental health







### **Progress Made: Colorado Naloxone Project**

### **Project Goal**

All Colorado hospitals and emergency departments distribute naloxone to at-risk patients, placing naloxone — a lifesaving medication — in patients' hands prior to their departure from the hospital.

### **Participating Hospitals**

Over 100 hospitals and urgent care/emergency clinics from across the state have agreed to participate

#### **723**

naloxone kits distributed by reporting facilities so far in 2021



## Progress Made: Behavioral Health Recovery Act of 2021

- Creates the Behavioral Health and Mental Health
   Cash Fund \$550M in total from the American Rescue
   Plan Act dollars
- Requires establishment of 2021 Behavioral Health Task Force to issue a report with recommendations on policies to create transformational change and for use of designated cash funds
- Funds designated for:
  - Prevention
  - Care Coordination
  - Workforce
  - Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders
  - Recovery Services
  - Services for Children and Youth


