SB21-137 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH RECOVERY ACT

More than **\$112M** investment addressing urgent behavioral health needs in FY2021-22

\$550M in total appropriated for behavioral health cash fund through 2024

OVERVIEW

- Creates the Behavioral Health and Mental Health Cash Fund: \$550 million in total from American Rescue Plan Act dollars
- Requires establishment of a 2021 Behavioral Health Task Force to issue a report
 with recommendations on policies to create transformational change and for
 use of designated cash funds
- Delays the convening of the Opioid and Other Substance Use Disorders Study Committee by one year

CARE COORDINATION
